### **Phonics**

#### Week 2

You will need paper and a pen/pencil. Use the letter formation sheet to help you.

### Session 1: Speed Sound: a

- 1. **Say the sound.** Bounce a-a-a-a. Open your mouth wide, as if to take a big bite of an apple. Ask your child to repeat. As for a-a-a-apple, a-a-a-ant, a-a-astronaut, a-a-a-crobat.
- 2. **Read the sound**. Write an "a" and next to it draw an apple. Run your finger round the apple saying a-a-a-a.
- 3. Repeat this several times.
- 4. **Air-write the letter.** Air-write "a", saying " round the apple and down the leaf' as you form the letter in the air with your finger. Refer to letter formation sheet. Repeat several times.
- **5. Fred Talk.** Remind your child that Fred can only say words in sounds and not the whole word.
- Say each word below in Fred talk. Ask your child to repeat. Allow your child to jump in and say the whole word if they can.

m-a-n man, m-a-d mad, s-a-d sad, j-a-m jam

7. Remember to practise "m" from last week too.

# Session 2

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- **2. Read the sound**. Write an "a" and next to it draw an apple. Run your finger round the apple saying a-a-a-a.
- 3. Repeat this several times.
- **4. Air-write the letter.** Air-write "a", saying ' round the apple and down the leaf' as you form the letter in the air with your finger. Refer to letter formation sheet. Repeat several times.
- **5. Write the sound.** Put some flour on a baking tray. Show your child how to make the sound in the flour saying the rhyme. Repeat several times. You could use rice, shaving foam, lentils etc.

### Session 3

- 1. **Sound hunt.** Go for a sound hunt around your house. Can you find things that begin with a.
- 2. **Write the sound.** Practise writing the sound. You could use a paintbrush and water, paint, crayons, felt pens. Remember to keep making the sound as you write.

### Session 4

- **1.Draw the objects.** Can you draw the objects you have found beginning with a?
- 2. Write the sound. Can you have a go at writing the sound?

# Session 5:

### Kim's Game

Play a version of Kim's Game using the objects you have found beginning with "a". Lay the objects out and look at them carefully. Cover the objects with a tea towel. Ask your child to cover their eyes while you remove one object. Can they guess which object you have removed? Put the object back and play agin removing a different object each time.
