Go on a coin hunt and collect together all the loose coins in your house, Can you sort them into different types and learn how much they are worth? Can you make a shop with your toys and practise buying things with the coins?	Junk modelling- using the recycling that you have at home. Can you have a go at planning what model you are going to make? Label the things you are going to use and create your model.	Find a favourite board game you have in your house and have a go at playing with your family. Try and challenge yourself. Can you figure out how many spaces you need to jump to get to the end? What two numbers add together to make that jump?
Go on a technology hunt in your house. Can you find all the things that need to be plugged in or turned on to work. Can you write or draw the things you find?	Choose an animal you love. Use the internet and any books you might have to find out facts about the animal. Can you find out its lifecycle and record this onto a piece of paper with some drawings and labels.	Go on an old photo hunt in your house. Get mummy and daddy and grandparents to get out their old photos and talk about them to you. How have people changed? What was different when mummy and daddy were younger? and when Grandparents were younger?
Choose a recipe and help a grown up to bake it. See if you can be in charge of the measuring-can you read the recipe book and measure the ingredients correctly?	Write an email / letter to your teacher to tell them what you've been doing, maybe you can send a photo. Your teacher may write back to you!	Go outside for a walk or into your garden and notice signs of Spring, can you find buds on trees, flowers growing, baby animals? Take photos or draw what you find and have a go at labelling them or writing a sentence about what it is.
