Common Exception Words - Family 8

Word 1: **love**

Meaning: **love** means to have great affection for.

Example: I **love** my cat.

Word 2: **come**

Meaning: **come** means to move towards something.

Example: **Come** to my house.

Your example:



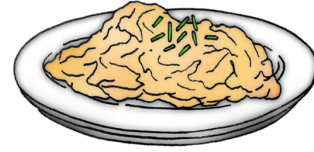
Trick: o come with an e

Now practise:

Word 3: **some**

Meaning: **some** means a certain amount.

Example: I want **some** dinner.

Now practise:

Word 4: **one**

Meaning: **one** means a single thing.

Example: There is just **one** left.

Trick: **one** is on the e

Now practise:

Word 5: **once**

Meaning: **once** means one time.

Example: I was here **once** before.

Trick: **once** on the c e

Now practise:

Word 6: **money**

Meaning: **money** means the notes and coins used to buy things.

Example: I got some **money** for my birthday.

Trick: **mon** - **e** - **y**

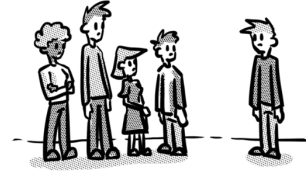
Common Exception Words - Family 9

Word 1: **friend**

Meaning: **friend** means a person who is seen as liked, loyal and an ally.

Example: My friend helped me.

Trick: fri - end to the end

Word 2: **said**

Meaning: **said** means it has been spoken.

Example: 'Welcome home,' I said.

Trick: a I said that

Word 3: **says**



Meaning: **says** means speaks or is speaking.

Example: She **says** she's ready.

Trick: s-ay-s

Now practise:

Word 4: **again**

Meaning: **again** means another or second time.

Example: He won **again**.

Trick: a I went **again**
