<u>English</u>

Session 1- Spellings- Complete the word search, looking for common exception words. Once you have done this, try writing sentences using the words without looking at how to spell the word.

Session 2- Watch the video on the link below and have a go at the activities on identifying errors in your writing.

Session 3- Choose a writing template that you would like to write a story about. Then answer the questions to help plan your story. Think about the characters, the setting and what is going to happen in the story.

Session 4- Have a go at writing your story that you planned yesterday. Have a look at the targets below. Try and include as many of these as possible.

Targets:

- Use capital letters and punctuation correctly.
- Join sentences together using or, and, but, when, if, that, because
- Use expanded noun phrases
- Use adjectives to describe
- Use apostrophes for contractions and possession
- Think about how you start each sentence.

Session 5- Edit your story. Read your story back. Do your sentences make sense? Have you included the targets above? Is your spelling correct? Can you improve any of your sentences?
