Boxed Success Criteria for Spooky Stories

- ✓ a PAF (purpose of writing, audience and form)
- ✓ the effect it will have on the reader
- ✓ list of everything that a spooky story should include
- ✓ examples of vocabulary that would be found in most spooky stories
