Wooden Hill School Sport Premium Report 2015-16

The Government is continuing their provision of additional funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. All state-maintained schools, academies, middle schools, special schools and pupil referral units which have primary aged pupils will receive the funding.

The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has. The sport premium is to be used to Increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport.

All schools with 17 or more primary-aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.

At Wooden Hill Primary and Nursery School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils. The 2015-2016 Sport Premium funding for Wooden Hill Primary and Nursery School was £9,375.

The money has been used for:

- Subject leader meetings to support PE Co-ordinators in their role developing PE & sport within the school
- A full organised annual programme of competitions/tournaments/festivals
- Increased investment in equipment for all children in PE lessons.
- Increasing the amount of competitive sport in which our children participate running sport competitions, and increasing pupils' participation in the Bracknell Forest Young People in Sports events and inter school competitions with the other schools.

Impact: The Sport Premium Funding has impacted our school in the following ways:

- Significant increase in amount of appropriate equipment for PE lessons and after school sport.
- Continued access to previously held sports festivals and competitions as well as a wider range of events to participate in including Y3/4 children having exposure to inter school competitions.
- The opportunity for P.E. to continue to develop and retain a high status within the school with more children wanting to take part in competitions.

We will continue to evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation arrangements. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways. We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school.

Plans for Further Investment in Children's P.E. & Sport Provision 2016-17

For the year 2016/17 we are continuing to benefit from the government sports premium funding. The amount is £9,375. We have updated a lot of resources to benefit the learning of the children and will look to continue to do this as well as adding some larger key pieces of equipment, especially for gymnastics. This equipment will last a long time and mean we can teach the children things we have not been able to do as of yet. The sports premium money will be spent on the following:

- Equipment for lessons and after school sport to further enhance the children's learning.
- Team kit which instils a sense of pride and togetherness when we go to competitions
- PE supply cover and a contribution towards the salary of a Specialist PE teacher.
