Communication and Language

This half term our theme is 'The Jolly Postman' and we will use the book as a overarching theme. We will explore many familiar stories within this including Goldilocks and the Three Bears and Jack and the Beanstalk. We will encourage retelling of these stories using actions and props. We will also encourage children to make up their own stories drawing on their own experiences

Physical Development

We will be learning about the importance of exercise and how we feel when we exercise. We will use large construction to build imaginative creations as well as obstacle courses for developing balancing, jumping and landing skills. We will continue to provide a range of fine motor tasks to build hand strength.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be continuing to learn about our school rules and thinking about ways we can show kindness. We will be talking about some of our favourite things and thinking about similarities and differences. We will use familiar stories to talk about friendship and kindness.



Suggested Books for Reading



Literacy

Each week we will look at different stories and the characters within them. We will continue to develop knowledge of print through our daily self registration activities and will encourage mark making for a range of purposes including letters, postcards and invitations. We will encourage talk through stories using picture prompts, repetition and props to support and develop understanding.



Mathematics

We will be exploring pattern in a range of ways including musical patterns. We will use a range of positional language through games and activities as well as exploring simple shapes, comparing these and begin to sort them into simple categories such as colour or size. We will continue to develop our knowledge of number through stories, rhymes and counting activities and begin to match quantity to numeral through a range of practical activities.



Understanding the World

This half term we will look at different characters within our stories to enable us to explore different occupations. We will also be learning about the world around us and talking about changes that take place during Autumn. We will also encourage children to share their experiences of special times and events, making links to celebrations including bonfire night and Christmas.



Expressive Arts and Design

We will encourage roleplay, drawing on children's own experiences as well as those we read about. We will explore sounds through songs and the use of musical instruments. We will explore a range of objects including those linked to autumn in a range of ways using methods such as printing and collage. We will also encourage children to develop their own ideas.



What you can do to help at home

- Read stories together often to help build a love of books.
- Look at Tapestry together and encourage your child to talk about activities that they have done at Nursery
- Play games together that encourage sharing and taking turns.
- When out together, encourage children to talk to you about what they notice (sounds, smells, objects, print etc).
