Governors are all volunteers, bringing different strengths and skills to the Governing Body. All have a commitment to helping the school.

We have a wonderful range of Governors from very different backgrounds and professions. This diversity makes us more effective.

Governors are appointed or elected for a four-year term, can stand or be elected for more than one term.

As shown above, we have vacancies, so if you are interested in becoming a governor, please contact the Clerk.

What is the role of the Governing body?

Our role is to provide independent oversight of the management and operation of Wooden Hill Primary & Nursery School, with the aim of improving the quality of education provided and raising standards.

We have 3 core functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the school and our pupils, and the performance management of staff
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure our money is well spent.

It is important to emphasise that the governing body does not run the school on a day-to-day basis. This is the job of Mr Garner as Head Teacher and other senior staff.

How does the Governing Body operate?

The **full governing body** meets every half term. This is where the most important business is considered.

We also have a number of committees. Some of these are statutory requirements, whereas others have been established by choice to enable us to undertake our core functions effectively.

In 2022/23, the following Committees were established:

- **Finance Committee**, which receives regular financial reports in order to monitor expenditure and ensure sound financial management;
- **Standards & Effectiveness Committee**, which receives regular reports in relation to school data and educational achievement;
- **Health & Safety Committee**, which supports and monitors compliance of our risk assessments and health and safety monitoring;
- Pay Committee, which will consider the annual pay and responsibility points for teaching staff.

Panel hearings can also be convened for certain functions.

Governors also have individual lead, or link, roles. These are aligned to curriculum areas, core functions and priorities and often undertaken through visits to the school for learning walks. These visits help governors to understand more about Wooden Hill and the reality of school life. These visits are not inspections but help us see how the school's strategy and vision is being implemented.

Key activities in 2022/23: Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction

In 2023, the Governing Body agreed that it was time to review our vision, in order to ensure that it was driving everything we are doing at the school.

This began by asking all of our stakeholders what they thought of the school – children, parents and staff all contributed to this. The feedback was really useful. It identified the Wooden Hill strengths to build on, whilst also confirming those areas that we need to improve.

The feedback was used to develop our new Vision for the whole school community. We want everyone at Wooden Hill to be READY for their next steps:

- Respectful
- Empowered
- Active
- Dedicated
- Yourself

This new vision will be used to shape all of our policies and strategies going forwards. It will also be used to develop a new three-year strategy for the school, setting out our priorities and plans.

Key activities in 2022/23: Holding Executive Leaders to account for educational performance

In September, Wooden Hill welcomed Mr Garner as our new Headteacher. Governors worked with Mr Garner to review the strengths and areas for improvement at the school. This informed a School Development Plan with four key priorities. The table below outlines these and gives a brief summary of the progress that has been made this year.

During the pandemic the Government sought to reduce the pressures on schools by reducing the requirements to report against performance data. This year we have received regular performance reports and Mr Garner and the Senior Leadership Team have enhanced the data provision to Governors to allow us to effectively monitor the progress and attainment.

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Key activities in 2022/23: Overseeing the financial performance of the school

Schools across the Country have faced significant financial challenges this year. The industrial action from Teaching Unions this year has not been a dispute about pay, but wider investment in the education sector. Wooden Hill is not alone in facing these pressures.

Our 2022/23 budget risked going into deficit without savings or additional income. It is thanks to the hard work of the Leadership Team that the school delivered another balanced budget where many schools are struggling.

Our 2023/24 budget has included additional resources for the new curriculum, and new approaches to some of our contracted services that will improve the value for money received by the school.

This year saw the conclusion of a very exciting project, with the opening of the Book Nook – a library that is the envy of many local primary schools.

The Governing Body would like to thank the Wooden Hill Fundraising Committee for all the events and activities that they have planned and delivered this year. Not only have they been lots of fun, but they have raised huge amounts of money to benefit the children at Wooden Hill.
