Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Forming new friendships, sharing, compromising and negotiating Being independent by taking care of belonging and managing personal needs in the new setting

Learning behaviour expectations - Team Stop, 1,2,3 and success criteria for lining up

Developing class rules and get to know the routine

Getting to know each other circle games

Introducing key groups at end of the day for story time/topic group time Introducing and recapping tough tortoise

Talking about likes and dislikes, what we can do well (proud clouds) What makes us unique

Colour monster story - focus on happy, sad, worried and identifying emotions and how to deal with them

<u>Self-Regulation</u>

Identify and moderate their own feelings Manage their own needs - personal hygiene <u>Managing Self</u> See themselves as a valuable individual Begin to show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge <u>Building Relationships</u> Begin to build constructive and respectful relationships

Physical Development

Becoming independent with toileting and personal hygiene in new setting Taking part in opportunities to develop gross motor skills and negotiating space in the Reception setting Introducing fine motor skills time after lunch Hand washing Pencil grip and letter formation. Using scissors and pencils with more accuracy Naming and identify parts of the body

<u>Gross Motor Skills</u>

Revise and refine the fundamental skills that they have already acquired: rolling, crawling, walking, jumping, running, hopping, skipping, climbing <u>Fine Motor Skills</u>

Use pencils, paintbrushes and scissors with increasing accuracy

Communication and Language

Listening to stories in small groups and as a whole class

Singing familiar rhymes and songs

Talk about our experiences and listening to others in key groups (talking about our families, talking about what we enjoy doing at school, talking about Summer Holiday experiences)

Playing games to develop listening skills

Listening, Attention and Understanding

Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important Learn rhymes, poems and songs <u>Speaking</u> Articulate their ideas and thoughts Engage in story times

Maths

We will follow White Rose Maths Schemes Matching pictures and objects Sorting objects Comparing size, mass and capacity Exploring simple patterns Copying, continuing and creating patterns Daily counting as part of our routine Introducing our visual timetable

<u>Number</u>

Recognise numerals of personal significance Recognise numerals 1-5 <u>Numerical Patterns</u> Copy, continue and create patterns <u>Shape, Space and Measures</u> Compare length, weight and capacity

Expressive Arts and Design

Self-portraits, looking in mirrors at features Collage Lots of opportunities to be creative in our continuous provision – painting, sticking, drawing with different media Accessing and exploring musical instruments

<u>Creating with materials</u> Explore different materials freely Explore a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings Draw with increasing complexity and detail, for example representing a face with a circle and including details <u>Being Imaginative and Expressive</u> Explore and engage in music making Engages in role play based on first hand experiences Begin to develop storylines in their pretend play Literacy Introducing Read Write Inc phonics Recognising our names Using vocabulary influenced by books Enjoying an increasing range of books, handling them appropriately Drawing using a range of shapes for our pictures. Understanding that writing carries meaning Writing our names Giving meaning to marks when writing, drawing and painting Begin to write our own messages using a range of letter like shapes and strings of familiar letters Forming the letters we are learning

Writing

Give meaning to marks as they draw, write and paint Use some print and letter knowledge in early writing Write some letters accurately <u>Word Reading</u> Hears and says the initial sounds in words Recognise their own names <u>Comprehension</u> Enjoy an increasing range of books, handling them appropriately

Understanding the World

Similarities and differences between each other Talking about our families and things we enjoy doing together Harvest festival Our Local setting - home and school Seasons - Autumn Making bread (Little Red Hen) Looking after our environment

<u>The Natural World</u> Explore the natural world around them Describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside <u>People, Culture and Communities</u> Talk about members of their immediate family or community Name and describe people who are familiar to them
