Important People

Mary Seacole—A British– Jamaican business-woman and nurse who set up the ‘British Ho-tel’ during the Crimean war.

Florence Nightingale—The founder of modern nursing. She was a manager and trainer of nurses during the Crimean war.

Edith Cavell- SA British nurse who cared for many wounded soldiers during World war 1.

Significant—important or worthy of attention.

Figure—a person

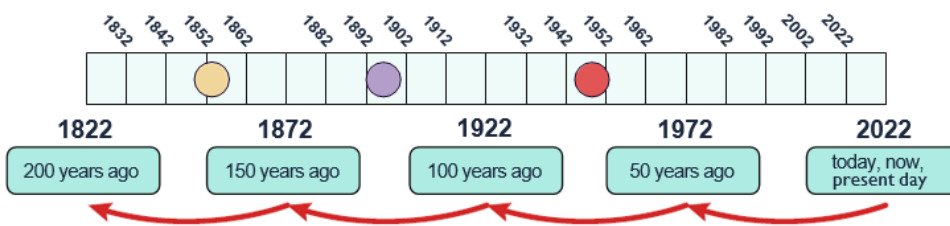
Historical—belonging to the past
