Key Vocabulary:

Hemisphere: half of a sphere; used to denote a portion of Earth

Globe: model of the Earth

Continent,: a body of land made up of different countries

Equator: an imaginary line around the middle of the Earth

Latitude: horizontal imaginary lines around the Earth

Longitude: vertical imaginary lines around the Earth

Trade,: buying, selling or exchanging goods

Fair Trade: the practice of buying goods directly from producers in <u>developing</u> countries at a fair price

European Union: organization of European countries which have joint policies on matters such as trade, <u>agriculture</u>, and <u>finance</u>.
