What's in the Woods?

Key Texts: We're Going on a Bear Hunt Owl Babies Night Monkey Day Monkey The Nativity Story The Night Before Christmas Father Christmas Needs a Wee The Colour Monster

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Continuing to establish rules and routines

Sharing, turn taking and negotiation in play

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Identifying}}\xspace$ emotions and developing strategies to respond to these -

introducing more emotions through colour monster (calm, angry)

Continuing to form and build on friendships

Talking about likes and dislikes and how these may be different from others.

Continuing to work on resilience and being a tough tortoise. Talking about what to do if we feel worried/sad about something Keeping safe -linked to Bonfire Night

Jigsaw PSHE: things that we are good at and that make us special, being kind, what to do if someone does something that is unkind.

Self Regulation

Identify and moderate feelings Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important <u>Managing Self</u> See themselves as a valuable individual

Begin to show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge Talk about feelings, using words such as 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried' <u>Building Relationships</u>

Express feelings and consider the feelings of others Talk with others to solve conflicts

Physical Development

Continuing to build on fine motor skills through a range of activities including pen disco and dough disco

Cutting with increasing control Forming recognisable letters with increased pencil control Moving in different ways, balancing and climbing Jumping off an object and landing appropriately Real PE

<u>Gross Motor Skills</u>

Develop the overall body strength, co-ordination, balance and agility needed to engage successfully with future physical education sessions

Confidently and safely use a range of large and small apparatus indoors and outside, alone and in a group

Fine Motor Skills

Develop their small motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently.

Communication and Language

Key group focus on speaking and listening skills Speaking and singing in the nativity Developing language through stories and role play: Woods and Christmas Grotto Sequencing a stories using pictures Using puppets and small world in play Learning about festivals and discussing own experiences Retelling the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt', using words to describe the grass, mud etc Looking at non-fiction books linked to topic Singing familiar rhymes

Listening, Attention and Understanding

Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important Learn new vocabulary and use it throughout the day

Listening carefully to new songs and rhymes, paying attention to how they sound Engaging in non-fiction books

<u>Speaking</u>

Describe events in some detail

Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding Retell stories, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text

Maths Numbers 1-5 Circles and triangles Shapes with 4 sides

Number Count objects, actions and sounds Subitise Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value

Understand the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers

Begin to recall number bonds for numbers 1-5

Shape, Space and Measures

Identify, name and compare shape (circles, triangles and 4 sided shapes)

Expressive Arts and Design

Firework dancing Rangoli patterns Re-enacting the Bear Hunt Christmas cards and crafts Singing and acting in nativity

Creating with materials Return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them Being Imaginative and Expressive

Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody.

Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses

Literacy

RWI phonics groups Orally retelling stories Talking about stories - likes and dislikes Drawing with growing detail. Begin to write using a wider range of letter strings and write some CVC words with support Making links between the sounds they learn in phonics and the letters they need for writing Writing initial sounds in captions and sentences Writing names with correct letter formation Writing lists and labels

Writing

Give meaning to marks as they draw, write and paint Use some print and letter knowledge in early writing Write some letters accurately Word Reading Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter sound

correspondences <u>Comprehension</u>

Re-read books to build up their confidence understanding and enjoyment

Understanding the World

Learn and talk about special traditions and celebrations: Remembrance Sunday, Diwali, Fireworks/bonfire night, Christmas Bears around the world Nocturnal animals

Understand the effect that their behaviour can have on the environment Seasonal change - Winter

The Natural World

Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live People, Culture and Communities

Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways
