<u>Kings noblemen and family:</u> The highest class was made up of the nobility. Aside from the king, nobles included priests, scribes, government officials, and elite warriors.



<u>Craftsmen and merchants:</u> They typically worked for a nobleman. Craftsmen were given a home, clothing, food, and other necessities for their families. They paid for these things with their crafts.

<u>Farmers:</u> The slaves were the lowest class and they were ordered to serve others. They had the worst living conditions and life expectancy. They lived in huts and worked very hard. They were responsible for providing food.
