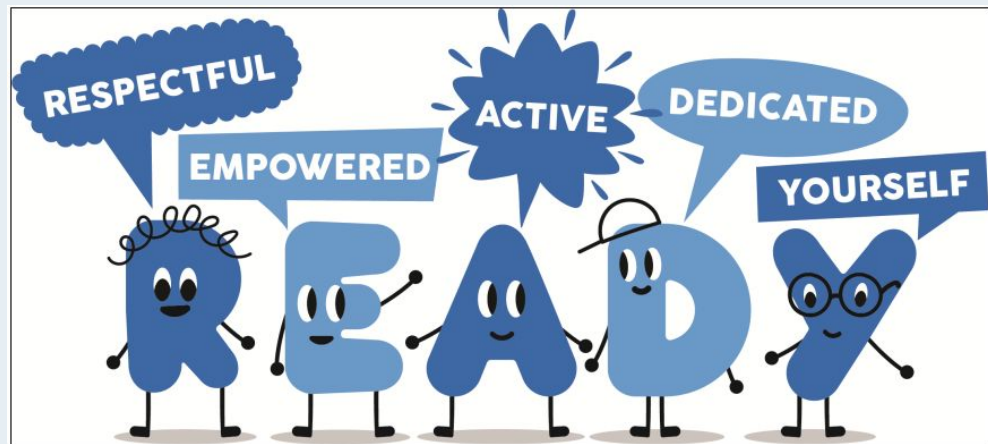

Daily routines and Timetable

- Each day we will have a soft start. The children begin with register and a morning task linked to our Emotional Literacy and Behaviour Curriculum
- Whole class reading
- Maths
- Assembly – Key Stage/Class/Singing/Celebration
- Break
- Writing
- Lunch
- Topic/Science/Art/PSHE/RE
- PE – Every Wednesday and Friday.
- On a Monday morning – Children will be taught Music/Computing & French and RE by Mrs Nunn / Mrs Brackstone.

Expectations

- In Year 4 we continue to develop the children's independence.
- All children are expected to have the correct equipment in school.
- Pencil cases are required and should be kept stocked with the necessary equipment – we can keep children stocked with classroom supplies when needed, but these are limited.
- Water bottles can go home each day please make sure they are named.
- Children are expected to take responsibility for their belongings in school and are regularly encouraged to do so.
- Children should not bring in special items from home

Reminder – Uniform

School uniform

- Grey school trousers / skirt/ shorts (any brand)
- White polo shirt (with or without logo) / shirt / blouse
- Royal blue and white summer dresses
- Royal blue sweatshirt / cardigan / jumper - with or without logo
- Grey / white socks or tights
- Black school shoes

PE uniform

- Royal blue t-shirt (with or without) logo
- Black tracksuit bottoms (plain)
- Black PE shorts (plain)
- Black hoody (with or without logo - no other logos, images or patterns permitted)
- Trainers or plimsolls

Other

- PE kits must be worn to school on PE day (except for Reception)
- Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied up at all times and accessories should be fitting with school uniform and functional. Large bows and other accessories are not permitted.
- Earrings must be small, plain studs. These must be removed for PE.

Reminder – Snacks

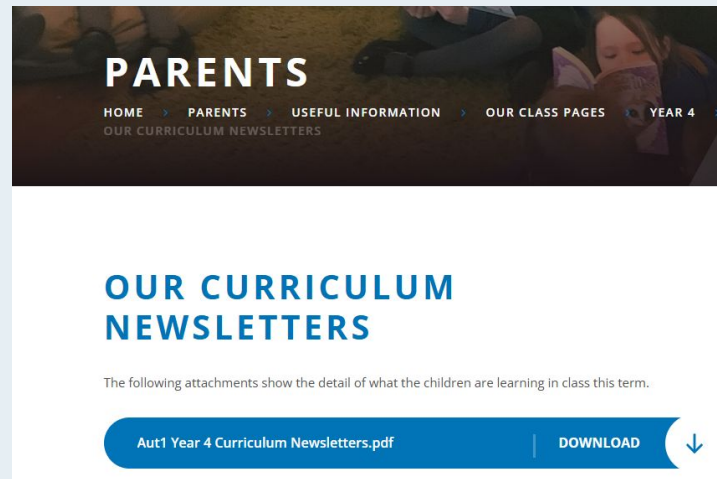
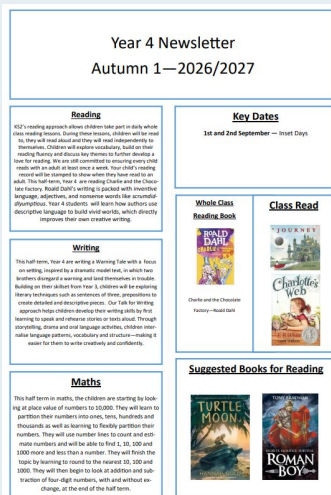
Healthy snacks

KS1 and EYFS are provided with break time snacks. In KS2 if bringing in a break time snack these can consist of fruit, breadsticks, cheese, rice cakes etc. The snacks should not include crisps, chocolate, biscuits or ultra-processed fruit snacks. Please note we are a nut free school.

While we don't send home formal homework tasks, we do ask that the children read daily and record this in their Reading Records.

Even if your child is an independent reader, please listen to them read frequently and engage in discussions about their texts and record this in their Reading Records

MTC

Some of you may already be aware of the MTC Year 4 testing process.

This is a national, statutory times table test that takes place in June.

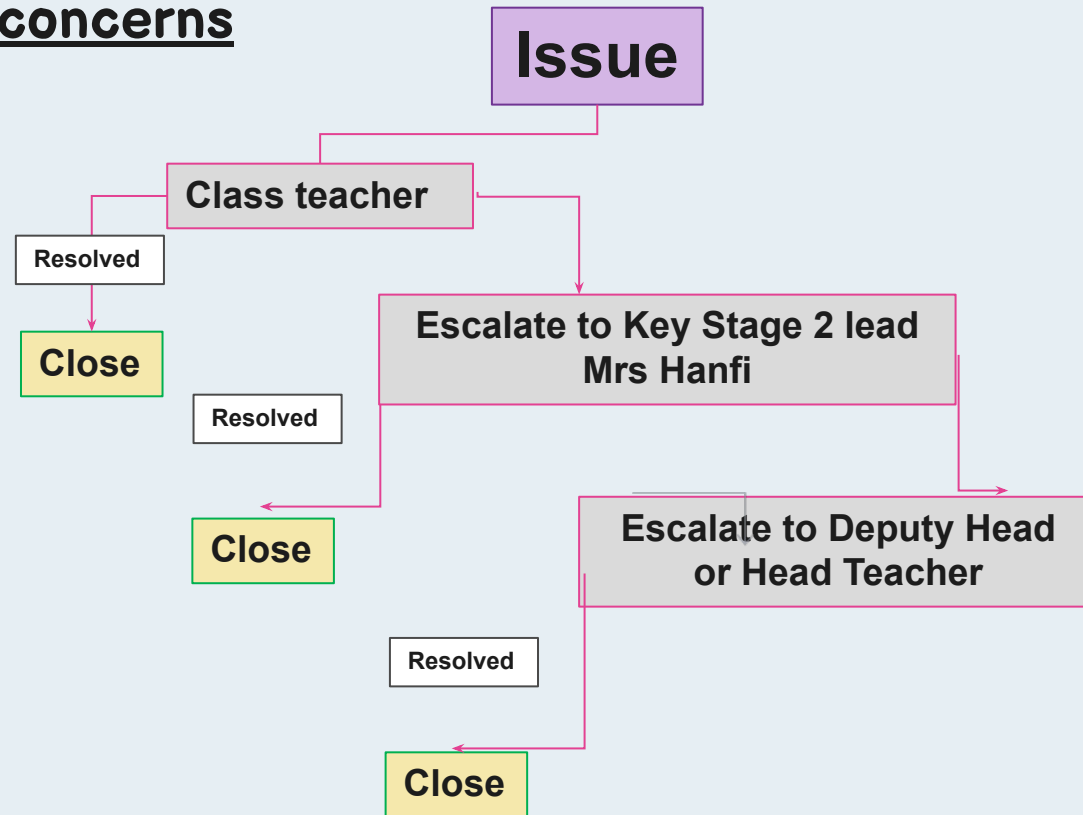
We will be working very hard on our times tables this year in order to support all children to achieve well in this testing.
